# What are Open Educational Resources?

- OER are digital and reusable learning/ instructional objects produced through teaching and training activities
- OER can be standalone items which aid teaching and learning, and do not necessarily have to be a full course
- OER can include handouts, essays, diagrams, animations, videos, presentation slides, reading lists, recorded lectures and seminars, and so on
- Student-generated content is a great exemplar demonstrating the outcome of learning, and can fulfil the dimensions of the Connected Curriculum to create work for a wider audience
